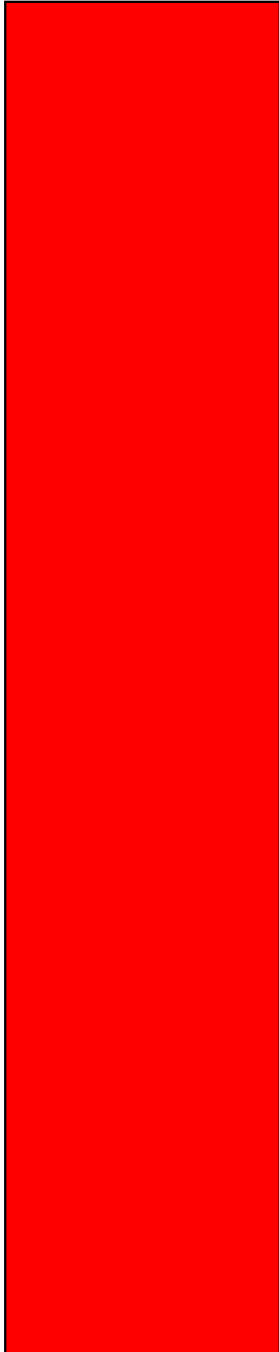


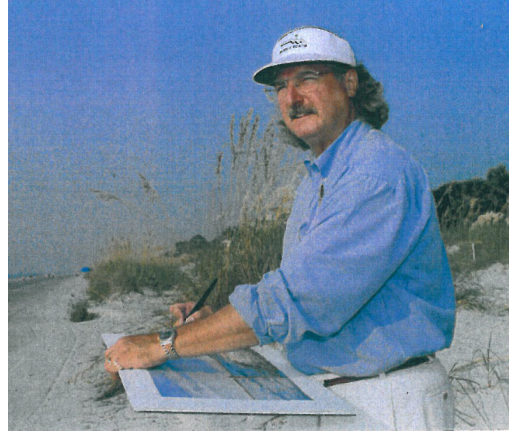

In 1987 Barry Honowitz moved from Southern California to Hilton Head Island to further his love for watercolor painting. Barry's work hangs in many corporate as well as private collections throughout the country.

Barry is a graduate of the Art Center College of Design in Pasadena, California. His background in design and advertising can be seen in paintings and promotional lithographs. He has more than 35 nationally published watercolors with images ranging from waterfowl to Harbour Town lighthouse on Hilton Head.

He conducts watercolor classes, has his own watercolor and design firm, and produces limited editions for both pro golf and tennis tournaments. Since moving to the island, he has produced the annual lithograph for the Heritage Golf Tournament. He has also painted PGA Tour lithographs including the Nabisco Championships in 1989 and 1990 and has a painting hanging in the PGA Headquarters in Ponte Vedra, Florida. He worked with the late Payne Stewart producing a commemorative print signed by Payne. He also has a lithograph of PGA Tour player Paul Azinger.

His paintings, which are highly collectable, feature the subtle use of color and detail. His motto is "Paint a Verbal Picture and Let Barry Honowitz Turn It into a Watercolor Painting."
